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

#### Welcoming Remarks – Warden Alex Morrison

The purpose of a Public Hearing is to permit members of the public to make their views known to Council, via oral or written submissions, concerning specific the application before Council.

This Public Hearing concerns File No. 2022 DA-001: an application received from Harry Wilson on September 28, 2022 for a Development Agreement Amendment: for the future expansion of MacBeth's Grooming and Kenne Boarding located on the land identified as parcel PID 05292347 at 10301 Highway 201 in the Community of Meadowvale.

All questions and comments throughout the public hearings are required to be addressed to the chair. The chair will afford an opportunity for public input and will ask that persons speaking identify themselves so that their comments may be recorded in the minutes of these proceedings and that the person speaking identify if they are speaking in favour or against the application. Written presentations are acknowledged first, followed by public oral presentations. Questions and comments from Council members are asked to be held until all public comment is heard.

#### **New Business**

Re: MacBeth's Grooming and Kennel Boarding Development Agreement Amendment

• **Presentation by Planner** – Application Specifics & Planning Process – B. Lamb In 2006, MacBeth's Grooming and Kennel Boarding located at 10301 Highway 201 (PID 05292347) entered into a development agreement with the Municipality of the County of Annapolis to expand the existing non-conforming animal kennel/grooming salon building located on the property.

Under the Municipal Government Act (MGA), Council may enter into a development agreement if the Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS) and the Land Use Bylaw (LUB) permits. The East End Area MPS and corresponding LUB allow for development agreements to expand an existing non-conforming commercial and industrial uses within the residential designation, Policy 1.5.1, as long as they are within the defined scope and requirements set out under Policy 9.3.1 and Policy 9.3.2.

The 2006 development agreement allowed for the expansion of the existing non-conforming animal kennel/groom salon building to include an additional twenty animal kennels and two supply closets, as well as an additional six animal kennels and an obedience training room in the loft.

The applicant is requesting to amend the development agreement not only to build the new open concept building to house large dogs during weather conditions where it is inappropriate for the dogs to stay outside. The amendment will also indicate where future expansions to the business can take place without future amendments, including an increase in size of the new indoor kennel space if more room is required, a new bathroom for staff to use, and a new outdoor kennel pad.

Mr Lamb, advised the applicant has not finalized Schedule 1, and therefore recommended should council be in favour of giving second and final reading of its intent to amend this development agreement, that the words "signed only once Schedule 1 submitted and approved by the Development Officer."

• **Presentation of the Request** – Applicant Harry Wilson

The applicant apologized for not having Schedule 1 available this date, and hopes time has not been wasted.

- MGA 228 (3) (b): The development agreement is signed by the property owner and the municipality.
- MGA 228 (3) (c): The signed copy is filed in the registry.

#### **Councillor Comments**

District 1 – Councillor Prout (as submitted)

Good day from District 1.I hope that all the Mothers in our communities were able to celebrate Mother's Day this past weekend. With the days finally warming up, it is wonderful to see the lawns turning green and the trees 'leafing out'. With Victoria Day quickly approaching it will soon be time when all gardeners will want to have their seeds planted, and after another ten days or so, will want to have their plants set out after the risk of frost has abated.

Please remember to exercise caution on our local roads as a number of farm vehicles and equipment will be on the move to prepare and to plant the fields of our many farms in Annapolis County.

A quick update on the Rainbow Riders Gymnastics & Trampoline Club in Middleton and the ten athletes from that club who qualified for Team Nova Scotia in Trampoline and Tumbling. They finished the 2023 Eastern Canadian Gymnastics Championships in Sherbrooke, Quebec on Sunday and they did very well. Rylee Armstrong of Spa Springs was the Flag Bearer for the Nova Scotia Team. I will have a more detailed report on this subject at the regular Council meeting in June.

District 2 – Councillor Connell reported that fund-raising breakfasts are starting – Margaretsville Fire Hall on the first Saturday of the month, and at the Port George Regional Recreation Centre on the first Sunday of the month. The Port George Jamboree is returning in July. We need to talk about promotion of volunteerism, fire services have asked us to consider doing something to promote volunteers, something out of the ordinary – radio ads, etc. for committees and groups. Spring is here.

District 4 – Councillor Barteaux noted that community halls are becoming more active. Moschelle Hall hosts a Card Night on Thursday nights. There will be a pancake breakfast on May 27<sup>th</sup>. Cycles are now on the road – please be aware to help prevent accidents. Also bikers need to be aware. Drive safe. It has been a dry spring – be aware of posted burn bans, check before you burn. Lots of valuable volunteer time is spent fighting fires. Hopes for rain for fire conditions, wells and gardens. Transplants are now available at the Thexton's Greenhouse in Lequille.

District 5 – Councillor Longmire also hopes for rain as it is extremely dry. Need to be mindful of fire bans, a burden on fire services. Attended lots of luncheons, meeting old and new friends. Need to support and recruit more volunteers. Attended the Atalanta Hospice Gala – amazing support that night. Lots of musical jams take place in her district. Come to the Crow's Nest in Hillsburn for great seafood, and check out local farm stands on your drives, i.e. - Mackenzie Mountain Road. Shop truly local.

#### District 6 – Warden Morrison (as submitted)

Attended Cornwallis Community breakfast - had a good opportunity to see and speak with many members of the extended community for the first time in years. Everyone has a story about the pandemic, how it affected them, how their lives changed and how they will relate to future activities. A member of County staff, with spouse, attended - a warm and welcome sight!

The next breakfast will be on Saturday 10 June.

The Cornwallis Park annual yard sale will be held on Saturday 3 June this event attracts folks from throughout our county as well as from other municipalities.

A few days ago, Elizabeth and I met two mothers and their children who were just entering one of the big fields at Cornwallis. They were there to play baseball and then go hunting for sea glass. This was not a rare occurrence as many individuals and families take advantage of the facilities on a regular basis.

The Upper Clements Picnic Park is attracting many visitors, including tourists. It is an attractive place in many respects and the local supporting organization and staff are to be commended for hard and productive work.

We all look forward to Saturday 24 July and the opening of the magnificent trails on the other side of Highway 1 from the picnic park.

This is gardening season. I have been told by those in the know that we ought to be sure not to be too hasty.

District 7 – Councillor Hudson wished a belated Happy Mother's Day to all mothers. A song out by Luke Bryan says 'I believe most people are good, and most mommas oughta qualify for sainthood'. There is a Roast Pork Supper on June 3 at the West Dalhousie Hall, with the proceeds going to Annapolis County Ground Search and Rescue, which began in West Dalhousie. On May 20<sup>th</sup> there is a plant and bake sale at the West Paradise Community Hall, with the proceeds to support the hall. On May 20<sup>th</sup> there will be an Open House fundraiser from 9-1 at the Paradise Heritage Centre Restoration Project.

#### District 8 – Councillor Gunn (as submitted)

Happy No-Mow May to all. I'd just like to remind everyone that the County has opted to "lead by example" with regards to not using Glyphosate on County-owned land. Remember that for home-use, there are always alternatives.

I've received communications about the following topics this month:

- Bear River water, and the dire need and responsibility for the County to address the lack of potable water in downtown Bear River;

- The condition of the Virginia Road left by logging trucks, as well as the lack of life-sustaining refuge blocks of forested tree-stands for wildlife in government owned land; and

- Commending the County for recognizing the importance of protecting our woodlands, and for setting an example with the upcoming Greywood location.

In other news, it being Mental Health Awareness month, I'd like to commend the Bear River & Area Health Clinic for becoming the first Virtual Care Hub in the Western Zone. That began in July of 2022, but for those interested in Virtual Care, there is an information session at the library in Digby on Warwick Street. The session runs from 2 to 3:30 on June 13<sup>th</sup> but registration is required by June the 11<sup>th</sup>.

The Forrester's Hall in Clementsvale is offering a cold plate take-out supper on June 23. Check out their Facebook page for more information. The next Market day at the Forrester's Hall will be Saturday May 27<sup>th</sup>.

There will be a guided walk at Mickey Hill this Sunday at 10:30am, hosted by the Mersey Tobeatic Research Institute. Check out their Facebook page and Eventbrite page to register for the event.

Gardening season is upon us, and I hope everyone takes the opportunity to get out there and work a piece of land for a garden. Growing food is not just good for your health and budget, but it combats food insecurity and is good for your mental health as well.

- District 9 Councillor Sheridan called attention to recent and ongoing wildfires and burn bans which affect our firefighters and volunteers. Bingo is starting in Nictaux on Saturday, May 27<sup>th</sup>, and every other Saturday.
- District 10 Deputy Warden Redden recognized patient and tolerant mothers. He added that the Lawrencetown Volunteer Fire Department will celebrate an antiversary on June 17 and will have their new pumper on display. Preparations are well underway for the Annapolis Valley Exhibition in August.
- District 11 Councillor LeBlanc also offered belated Mother's Day wishes. She Spent day with her grandchildren and children. Three Rivers Community Centre had successful fund-raising turkey supper last week stay tuned for more and check their website. #### Warden's June Update and Forecast

Attended police, fire, search and rescue, and security outdoor show in Middleton. I had a good talk with the search and rescue folks and assured them of our continuing support. Deputy Warden Redden and Councillor Prout were there as well. Other Councillors were on scene later.

Attended interesting and informative workshop on homelessness. It took place at NSCC Middleton. Councillors Gunn, Prout and Barteaux were in attendance as well. CBC is interested in what we are doing to home those in need of shelter.

26, 27 May saw a fantastic regional track meet held at the Bridgetown Sports Hub. Organizers tell me over 2,000 attended the event. It was heart-warming and reason-for-the-hub satisfaction to see. I chatted with a woman from the South Shore who was there with her two sons - both competitors. She was gushing in her praise. Later, she came back to me and said we have a desperate lack of automobile charging stations. She is NOT a fan of trickle charging.

Next year is the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D-Day.

From 8 to 10 June I attended the Atlantic Mayors' Congress (A Forum for Regional Leadership) in Amherst. All four provinces were represented. With substantial assistance from the CAO (obtained by adroit handling of various electronic devices), I suggested, presented and had accepted a media release emphasizing the need for urgent action on assuring the stability of the Isthmus of Chignecto.

Presentations included: Rising Sea Levels in the Isthmus of Chignecto, Atlantic Police Academy, Basic Income Concept, Livable Cities, Harassment and Lack of Civility in Municipal Government, and School of Towns (a concept for improving all aspects of town life). Premier Tim Houston spoke at the annual dinner and took the time to meet and chat with all delegates.

This is an important forum for exchange of views, adopting unified positions on pressing matters, and ensuring continued and improved municipal government.

With Councillors Gunn, Prout, and Barteaux, I attended the annual meeting of the Southwest Nova Biosphere organization on 14 Jun, welcomed delegates to Annapolis County and expressed the hope that they would return. Debra Ryan delivered an intriguing presentation on Delap's Cove as an Amazing Place. County staff have been working for years to earn this coveted recognition. Flyers inviting one and all to the opening of the Upper Clements trails system were delivered.

Upcoming is the multi-day program of visits, musical performances, meals and speeches commemorating the visit of a delegation from Royan, France, which is twinned with Annapolis Royal. There are 11 visitors from France. Pierre Duga, Sieur de Mons, 1560-1628, is responsible for his work which led to the founding of Port Royal. I will be attending, and bringing greetings from the County at the main events and will bring you an update next month on how all progressed over the weekend. This whole venture has the support of Annapolis County and that support is well presented in all event publicity documents.



#### RECOMMENDATION

That Council approve an investment of \$25,000 in Basin Aquatics Association to assist with the re-establishment of the aquatics facility at Basin Centre, Cornwallis Park;

AND THAT Council authorize the withdrawal of \$25,000 from the Recreation Reserve to be used for this purpose.

#### **BACKGROUND**

In June 2021, Municipality of the County of Annapolis made the decision to close the Basin Centre because it was deemed unsafe to use and no insurance company would provide the Municipality with insurance on the building. In July of 2021, the Municipality sold the building and 4.24 acres of land to 4337611 Nova Scotia Limited. The Municipality had previously acquired the building and leased it to the YMCA to operate, but continued to own the building structure and provided a grant to the YMCA along with the Municipality of the District of Digby.

At the May 9, 2023, Committee of the Whole meeting, Burt McNeil, from the Basin Aquatics Association made a presentation to Council to request \$125,000 in funding annually to help pay their expected annual rent payment of \$88,000 plus other operating expenses. He noted that Municipality of Digby has been asked for \$25,000, Town of Digby \$25,000, and Town of Annapolis Royal \$15,000. Mr. McNeil stated that they are hoping to obtain a 25-year lease and to generate \$400,000 a year in

memberships. He also noted that they are looking for other grant funding programs as well. This information was also presented to April 11, 2023, Committee of the Whole meeting with the exception of the exact amount of the financial ask which is now \$125,000 annually.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Staff reached out to the Basin Aquatics Association a couple weeks ago to obtain information on their future plans, incorporation documents, budget, and past financial statements. As they were only incorporated on March 24, 2023, they do not have any previous audited financial statements.

The Association provided staff with a copy of their draft facility lease with Basin Centre Inc. to lease 12,800 square feet of the building at 1041 Highway 1, Cornwallis, from May 1, 2023, to April 30, 2025. Included in the lease is a requirement for the Association to pay a portion of the overall building operating expenses including taxes, management fees, heating, airconditioning, electricity, water, waste disposal, sewage, operating supplies, lawn care, snow removal, cleaning and security, building and liability insurance, and other direct operating costs.

The Association's proposed two-year operating budget, with year one showing only 10 months, has also been provided. For simplicity purposes, this report is providing details of the full year 2 only as this is deemed to be the best-case scenario for selling memberships and better understanding operating costs.

The proposed budget shows membership sales of about \$30,000 per month, municipal support of \$14,500 per month for a total of \$666,831 for the full year. There are also revenues shown for day passes and sponsored events.

Operating expenses reflected in the Association's proposed budget include \$25,000 for pool chemicals, \$14,280 for insurance, \$45,000 for repairs and maintenance, \$87,120 for lease payments, \$238,371 for operating expenses of the total building, \$217,240 for wages, and other miscellaneous expenses totalling \$684,011, leaving a year end deficit of \$17,180.

Because the Society is a new organization it is hard to tell whether they will be able to sell the required memberships and create a sustainable business plan in the building with such a high rental rate. However; the benefits of providing increased recreational and healthy living options to residents of the western part of Annapolis County are also important. Therefore, Council should consider an investment to support the early stages of the initiative to determine whether the community is willing to also invest in this facility by directly buying memberships and using the facility, and to gain important knowledge on the true operating expenses for the facility. This support will also allow the Society time to garner other government and community funding.

#### **LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY**

Section 65A of the Municipal Government Act states that

- (1) Subject to subsections (2) to (4), the municipality may only spend money for municipal purposes if (a) the expenditure is included in the municipality's operating budget or capital budget or is otherwise authorized by the municipality; (b) the expenditure is in respect of an emergency under the Emergency Management Act; or (c) the expenditure is legally required to be paid.
- (2) The municipality may expend money provided for in an operating budget or capital budget for a purpose other than that set out in the operating budget or capital budget for that fiscal year if the expenditure does not affect the total of the amounts estimated for the operating budget and the capital budget.
- (3) The municipality may authorize expenditures from its operating budget or transfer money from the operating budget to its capital budget if the total amount of such expenditures and transfers for the fiscal year does not exceed the total amount of estimated revenue from all sources in excess of the amount estimated for those sources in the operating budget for that fiscal year.
- (4) The municipality may authorize capital expenditures that are not provided for in its capital budget if the total of such expenditures does not exceed the greater of (a) the amount authorized to be transferred from the operating budget to the capital budget under subsection (3); (b) the borrowing limits established for the municipality under Section 86; or (c) the amount withdrawn from a capital reserve fund under subsection 99(4).

(5) In the event of ambiguity in whether or not the municipality has the authority under this or any other Act to spend money or to take any other action, the ambiguity may be resolved so as to include, rather than exclude, powers the municipality had on the day before this Section came into force.
