


Annapolis County 2023 Waste Collection Map

Spring Clean Up: April 11-21, 2023
Fall Clean Up: September 12-22, 2023

Spring/Fall Clean Up occurs on your regular scheduled waste collection day or alternate day due to holiday during the weeks specified.

Spring and Fall Clean Up

Spring and Fall Clean Up occurs the weeks of April 11–21, 2023 & September 12–22, 2023 during your regular pick up day.

- Your Spring or Fall Clean-Up will occur on one day only.
- In all cases, normal waste-resource collection (recyclables, compost carts and garbage) stays on the same schedule.
- All items must be roadside by 6:00 am on pick up day, and may not go out more than 7 days prior to the clean-up; no later than the Sunday before your collection.
- No more than 20 bags per stop (loose items not bagged will be considered 1 bag).
- Any bagged items must be in clear transparent bags.
- No more than 2 appliance type items per stop.
- Furniture items no more than 200 lbs; other items no more than 75 lbs each.

Examples of items that will be picked up:

- Washer, dryer, stove
- Fridge, freezer, air conditioner, dehumidifier - with CFC sticker
- Furniture, mattress
- Water tank, boiler
- Carpet (rolled in 4ft lengths)
- Construction waste (tied securely in bundles)
- Pine needles (in clear bags)
- Small auto parts (no fuel or fluids)
- Empty oil storage tank
- ATV tires and small tractor tires

Items that won't be picked up:

- Electronics: televisions, computers, monitors, printers, audio & visual playback and recording systems, telephones, microwaves, etc.
- Leaves and brush
- Cardboard boxes
- Large or heavy auto parts
- Household hazardous waste, paint & motor oil
- Propane cylinders
- Automotive tires
- Automotive batteries
- Fridge, freezer, air conditioner, dehumidifier - without CFC sticker

Medical Waste: Please contact your local pharmacy for safe sharps containers and details for their pharmacy return program.


Tires: Return up to four regulated used tires to any tire retailer in the province during their regular business hours - free of charge. Includes: Car and truck tires, motorcycle tires, camper tires and trailer tires. This is a Divert NS program.

Annapolis County Householder's Sorting Guide 2023

COMPOST CART

ORGANICS



- All food waste (includes meat, fish, bones & shells)



- Cooking oil and fat



- Cat Litter (placed in a compostable bag)



- All soiled & non-recyclable paper (tissues, napkins, paper towels, paper plates, wrapping paper, sugar & flour bags, pizza boxes & detergent boxes)



- Yard Waste (leaves, brush, sawdust, weeds)



- Coffee filters and tea bags

NOT FOR COMPOST CART

- NO plastic bags. Biodegradable and oxo-degradable bags (only 100% compostable bags permitted)
- NO ashes, grass, soil or sod
- NO pet waste (except kitty litter)
- NO coffee cups, milk cartons
- NO glass or metal

RECYCLING BLUE BAG 1

NON PAPER



- All plastic containers (food containers, cake/cookie trays, shampoo bottles, cleaning fluid bottles and windshield fluid containers etc.)



- All redeemable beverage containers
Tip: Return to Enviro-Depot™ for refund



- All plastic bags



- Milk containers and glass bottles/jars (remove caps and lids)



- Aluminum foil and plates



- Tin/aluminum food cans



- Foam polystyrene trays, plates, cups and cartons

NOT FOR NON PAPER RECYCLING

- NO paper
- NO plastic cutlery
- NO disposable cups
- NO bottle/carton caps or tabs
- NO broken glass

RECYCLING BLUE BAG 2

PAPER



- Boxboard including frozen pizza outer packaging



- Paper egg cartons



- Newsprint and flyers



- Envelopes



- Catalogues, paperbacks, magazines and phone books



- Shredded/intact paper



- Breakdown and place in paper recycling, or flatten and bundle corrugated cardboard boxes (no larger than 3 ft. x 2 ft. x 1 ft.)
- Two bundles per pickup

CLEAR BAGS

GARBAGE



- Aerosol cans (empty), incandescent light bulbs



- Other pet waste



- Sharp items: Broken glass/knives (boxed or wrapped)



- Coffee cups, coffee pods



- Potato chip bags and wrappers



- Toothpaste, toothbrushes & floss



- Diapers



- Toys, unused clothing and footwear (tip: consider donating)



- Small appliances

BAG LIMITS

BAG LIMITS (4 Clear + 4 Blue = 8)

- Black Bag may be substituted for 1 Clear Bag. Acceptable black bag items: personal hygiene, medical and incontinence care waste

Garbage Clear Bag:

- Limit of 4 (bags cannot be longer than 39 inches when flat)
- Maximum weight of full bag is 15 kg (30lbs)
- 1 Black Bag may be substituted for 1 clear bag. **Acceptable Black Bag Items: personal hygiene, medical and incontinence care**

Recycling Blue Bag:

- Limit of 4 (bags cannot be longer than 39 inches when flat)
- Maximum weight of full bag is 15 kg (30lbs)
- Recyclables must be CLEAN & DRY and separated appropriately

HOUSEHOLD SPECIAL WASTE



- Batteries, fluorescent lights, motor oils and gas, insecticides, poison, propane tanks and paint
- Items may be dropped at the Western Centre at 343 Elliot Road, Lawrencetown, south of HWY 101, Exit 19
- Please contact the Western Centre for fees and hours of operation at 1 (877) 927-8300

Compost Carts

- Compost Carts are assigned to the **property**, not the owner
- If you move, the bin **MUST** stay at the property
- Call or email waste information to arrange delivery of a bin for a new house or for bin repairs

Frozen Compost Cart?

Try these Helpful tips to prevent the contents of your compost cart from freezing:

- Line the bottom of your cart with newspaper or a pizza box
- Wrap food scraps in newspaper, a cereal box or a paper bag
- Place your cart in a sunny location
- Use a paper yard waste bag to line your compost cart
