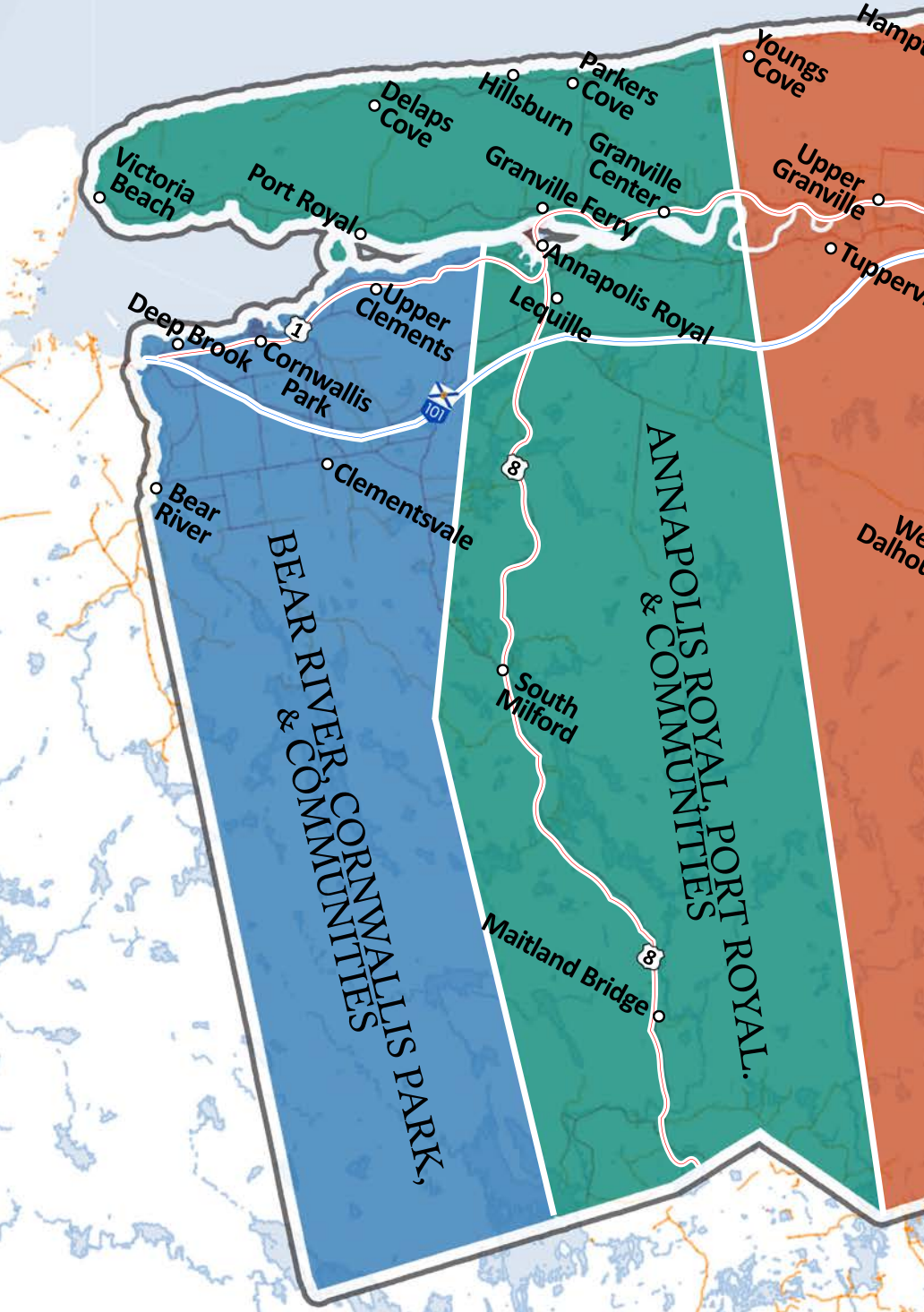

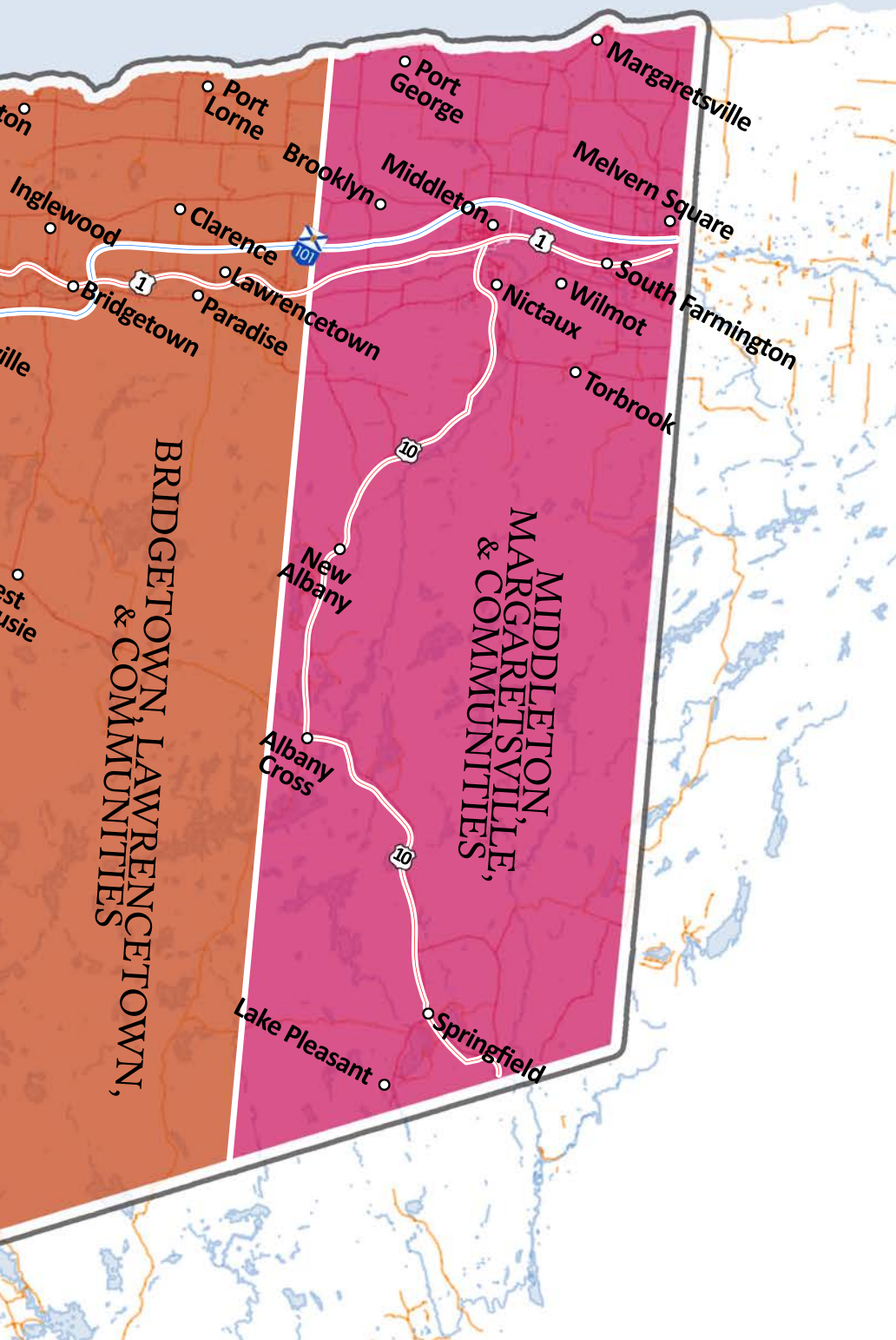

The museum is located in the former Macdonald Consolidated School building, which was the first consolidated school building in Canada. It was Founded by Sir William C. Macdonald, educational philanthropist, and operated from 1903 to 1979. The museum collections include historical artifacts of the area, research Library for genealogical historical research, recreated classroom and general store, a small natural history exhibit, including species at risk, and houses the Nova Scotia Clock collection.

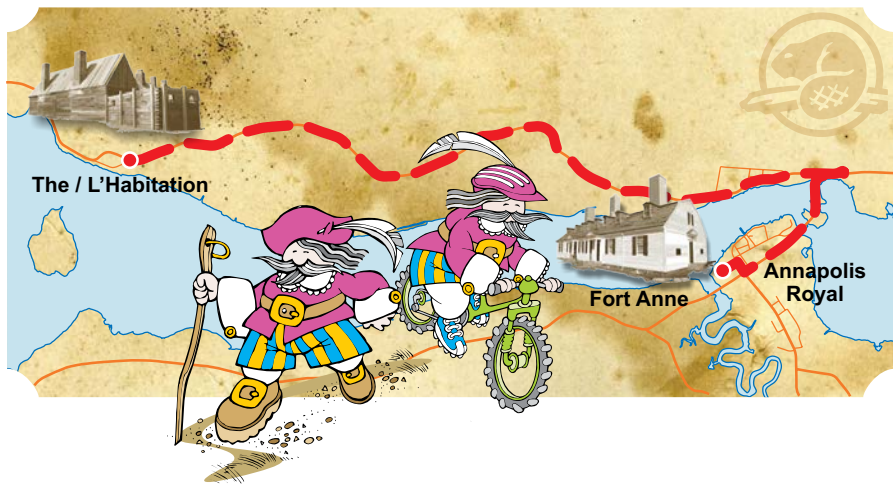

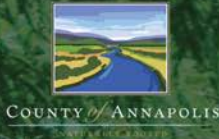

## WILDFIRE-RISK SEASON

Domestic burning can lead to wildfires. During wildfire-risk season, March 15–Oct 15, you must check before you burn brush. *That includes campfires!*
