Please be advised, the Selection Committee will be provided the write-ups in full but the biographies may be edited later for space requirements in regards to any promotions, publications, etc.

Topics to consider when preparing your volunteer's biography:

- When did s/he start volunteering?
- Do they currently volunteer?
- What makes this person stand out? (max. 100 words)
- What motivated them to start volunteering? (max. 50 words)
- What kind of impact has s/he made to their community? (max. 100 words)
- Highlight some of the volunteer representative's volunteering career. (max. 100 words)
- How does his/her services affect the organization s/he volunteers for? (max. 100 words)
